The Margaret River Region is home to three species of black cockatoo—two white-tailed black cockatoos; Baudin's Black Cockatoo and Carnaby's Black Cockatoo both listed as endangered, and one red-tailed black cockatoo; Forest Red-tailed Black Cockatoo listed as vulnerable.

Our Goal

Our goal is to raise \$10,000 for Nature Conservation Margaret River Region's Black Cockatoo Conservation Program.

On Saturday, 4 April 2020, Rankin Salinas is determined to run the iconic Cape to Cape Track - from Cape Leeuwin lighthouse to Cape Naturaliste lighthouse, a 135km track in under 24 hours.
